The *Bulletin Analytique d'Histoire Romaine* (BAHR) has constituted a bibliographic and analytical database on Roman History in the broadest sense. The exploitation of the resources constituted from the analysis of more than 800 French and foreign journals dealing with the ancient Roman world entails the selection, the input and the scientific validation of the data. But how to use them, or reuse them, afterwards? We have set up an automated creation of web, PDF or textual documents, allowing us to save a considerable amount of time and to offer different views on the works carried out in the framework of research in history, archaeology, epigraphy, numismatics, papyrology and many other disciplines.
